February 3, RCAF Captain Jim Brodie presented a humorous but serious description of 'delivering stuff' in various arenas of need in the world. Specifically he gave examples of his personal heroes of the 436 Squadron from Burma in 1944 to Afghanistan today. In addition he described the first delivery by the 436 to Haiti the day after the earthquake January 12, 2010 and the return flight with over 100 Canadians. The 436 is a tactical squadron. He encouraged us to write the troops at www.forces.gc.ca.

Guests Dana Johnston and Mike Voskamp provided information, including floor plans, on their proposal for 9 condominium residences to be built on the east side of Victoria Street south of Colborne Creek – presently a vacant lot. Several questions were asked by the members.

February 17, Mary Anne Rowlands, The Help Centre's managing director, described the various services provided to Northumberland residents in her Cobourg office. The Centre is funded primarily by the United Way. Income, Housing and Health Securities are the focus programs provided. Mary Anne described the increased use her Centre has experienced in the past year due to lost jobs and increased social stress in our community. She has two staff (including herself), contract employees and several volunteers. Of special note is a fund raising effort called 'Empty Bowls' to be held March 11 in Cobourg.
