President's Message



Remembrance Day comes but once a year but over the decades, cities, towns, and villages have created memorials to remember the sacrifices of all military personnel.

As Sir Winston Churchill said, in an address to British Parliament in 1940, of the sacrifices made in battle: "Never in the field of human conflict, was so much owed by so many to so few". It was a message to our allies and enemies that the sacrifices of members of the military should be recognized and remembered for all time.

The Sacrifice Medal (a new Canadian Medal which was instituted in August 2008) is equivalent to the Purple Heart, so on November 11 when attending your local cenotaph, look for this medal and thank the one who wears it.

Remember during the week or so leading up to November 11, to buy a poppy from one of your local Legion members and wear it proudly to show your continued support for our Canadian forces.

DID YOU KNOW? Red bananas are sweeter and more nutritious than the yellow ones.
