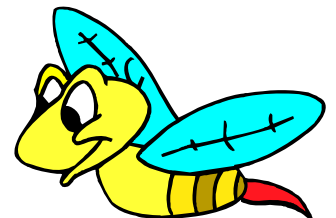
A club filled with volunteers and individuals with enthusiasm absolutely makes the role of president. It also makes the role very easy and a joy to assume.

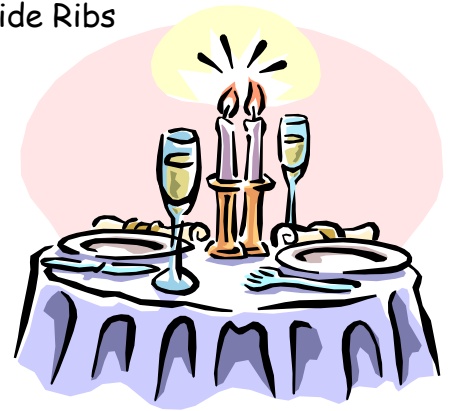

A recent study found the average Canadian golfer, walks about 900 miles a year.

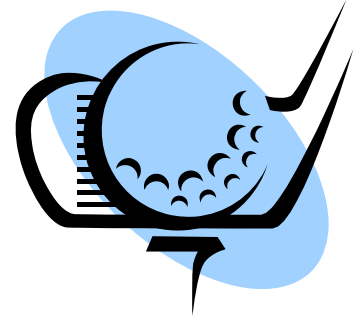
Another study found Canadian golfers drink, on average, 22 gallons of alcohol a year.
